

Ordinance No. 186

An Ordinance defining the boundaries of the City of Burlingame.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Burlingame:

Section 1.

The limits of the City of Burlingame are hereby defined and declared to be as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section 10, township 15, range 14 east of the Sixth principal meridian; thence south to the center of section 15, township 15, range 14 east of the Sixth principal meridian; thence east to a point 78 rods and 7 links west of the northeast corner of section 15, township 15, range 14 east of the Sixth principal meridian; thence south 96 rods to the north line of the right-of-way of the M.A. & B. railroad company; thence northeasterly along the north line of said right-of-way to the east line of said section 15; thence north to the northeast corner of said section 15; thence east to the center of section 14, township 15, range 14 east of the Sixth principal meridian; thence north to the northeast corner of the southeast quarter of section 11, township 15, range 14; thence west to a point 148-1/2 feet east of the southwest corner of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section 11, township 15, range 14 east of the Sixth principal meridian; thence northeasterly along the west side of the public road 968 feet; thence west 505 feet to the west line of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of said section 11; thence south 900 feet to the southwest corner of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section 11, township 15, range 14 east of the Sixth principal meridian; thence west to the place of beginning.

Section 2.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication once in the Osage County Chronicle.
