

ORDINANCE NO. 1904

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PLACEMENT OF CERTAIN SEWER SYSTEMS WITHIN THE CITY OF BURLINGAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS:

Section 15-413 of the Code of the City of Burlingame is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SAME; PERMIT. Before commencing construction of a private sewage disposal system, the owner shall first obtain a written permit signed by the utility superintendent. If such construction involves the placement of a private sewage disposal system within an area zoned "Industrial District" pursuant to the Code of Zoning Regulations for the City of Burlingame, Kansas, approval by the governing body must also be obtained prior to any construction. The application shall be accompanied by any plans, specifications or other information deemed necessary by the utility superintendent. A permit and inspection fee of \$20 shall be paid to the city at the time the application is filed."

Section 15-415 of the Code of the City of Burlingame is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SAME; DISCHARGE. (A) The type, capacities, location, and layout of the private sewage disposal system shall comply with all recommendations and requirements of the Water Pollution Control Section of the Kansas State Department of Health. No permit shall be issued for any private sewage disposal system employing a cesspool, lagoon or other such facility unless located within an area zoned "Industrial District" pursuant to the Code of Zoning Regulations for the City of Burlingame, Kansas. No permit shall be issued for any private sewage disposal system employing subsurface soil absorption facilities where the area of the lot is less than one acre. No septic tank or cesspool shall be permitted to discharge to any public sewer or natural outlet.

(b) At such time as a public sewer becomes available to a property served by a private sewage disposal system, as provided in section 15-402, a direct connection shall be made to the public sewer in compliance with this article, and any septic tank, cesspool, and similar private sewage disposal facilities shall be abandoned and filled with suitable and acceptable materials."
