

ORDINANCE NO. 1984

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC AND ESTABLISHING STOP SIGNS AT DESIGNATED INTERSECTIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS.

WHEREAS, the City of Burlingame, Kansas has determined by a traffic study that stop signs are needed at certain intersections and the placement of the same would be in the interest of public safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE/ BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS:

Section 1. There shall be placed a traffic control sign for purpose of regulating traffic at the following designated intersections in the City of Burlingame, Kansas:

- a) At the intersection of Dacotah Street and Seward Street, a stop sign shall be erected on Dacofcah Street for southbound traffic.
- b) At the intersection of Hall Street and Osage Street, stop signs shall be erected on Osage Street for northbound and southbound traffic.
- c) At the intersection of Osage Street and Chase Street, stop signs shall be erected on Chase Street for eastbound and westbound traffic.
- d) At the intersection of Chase Street and Seneca Street, stop signs shall be erected on Seneca Street for northbound and southbound traffic.
- e) On the southwest corner of the intersection of Jackson Street and Dacotah Street, a stop sign shall be erected for traffic entering onto Dacotah Street.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any traffic control sign erected in accordance with this ordinance, and any person found guilty or convicted or upon entry of a plea of guilty or nole contendre for a violation of this ordinance, shall be subject to a fine in an amount not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$ 50.00 for each violation.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the governing body, approval by the Mayor, and publication in the official city newspaper.
