

ORDINANCE NO. 2071

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING SUNDAY SALES OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AND CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE IN THE ORIGINAL PACKAGE WITHIN THE CITY OF BURLINGAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME:

Section 1: Sale of Cereal Malt Beverage.

Pursuant to 2005 Kansas Session Laws, Ch. 201, the sale at retail of cereal malt beverage in the original package is allowed within the city on any Sunday, except Easter, between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00pm.

Section 2: Sale of alcoholic liquor.

Pursuant to 2005 Kansas Session Laws, Ch. 201, the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor in the original package is allowed within the city on any Sunday, except Easter, between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00pm, and on Memorial Day, Independence Day and Labor Day.

Section 3: Publication.

This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official newspaper.

Section 4: Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect 61 days after publication or on November 15, 2005, whichever is later, unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided in 2005 Kansas Session Laws, Ch. 201, in which case this ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

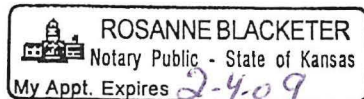

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING SUNDAY SALES OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AND CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE IN THE ORIGINAL PACKAGE WITHIN THE CITY OF BURLINGAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME:

Section 1: Sale of Cereal Malt Beverage.

Pursuant to 2005 Kansas Session Laws, Ch. 201, the sale at retail of cereal malt beverage in the original package is allowed within the city on any Sunday, except Easter, between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 p.m.

Section 2: Sale of alcoholic liquor.

Pursuant to 2005 Kansas Session Laws, Ch. 201, the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor in the original package is allowed within the city on any Sunday, except Easter, between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 p.m., and on Memorial Day, Independence Day and Labor Day.

Section 3: Publication.

This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official newspaper.

Section 4: Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect 61 days after publication or on November 15, 2005, whichever is later, unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided in 2005 Kansas Session Laws, Ch. 201, in which case this ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
