

**ORDINANCE NO. 2182**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC AND ESTABLISHING YIELD SIGNS AT DESIGNATED INTERSECTIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Burlingame, Kansas has determined by a traffic study that stop signs are needed at two intersections and the placement of the same would be in the interest of public safety and welfare.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS:**

**SECTION 1.** There shall be placed traffic control signs for purpose of regulating traffic at the following designated intersections in the City of Burlingame, Kansas:

- (a) At the intersection of Dayton Street and Seneca Street, stop signs shall be erected for east and west bound traffic.
- (b) At the intersection of Seward Street and Seneca Street, stop signs shall be erected for east and west bound traffic.

**SECTION 2.** It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any traffic control sign erected in accordance with this ordinance, and any person found guilty or convicted or upon entry of a plea of guilty or nolo contendere for a violation of this ordinance, shall be subject to a fine in an amount not less than \$20.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each violation.

**SECTION 3.** This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the governing body, approval by the Mayor, and publication in the official city newspaper.

and publication in the official city  
newspaper.

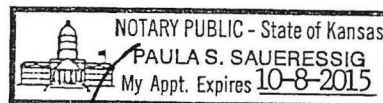
