

ORDINANCE NO. 1931

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE UNLAWFUL DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN THE CITY OR UPON CITY OWNED PROPERTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge or fire any gun, rifle, pistol, revolver, cannon or artillery type weapon within the city limits or upon any city owned or controlled property.

SECTION 2: Section 1 shall not apply:

- (a) To the discharge of firearms by any duly authorized law enforcement officer when necessary to the discharge of his or her official duties;
- (b) To the discharge of firearms in any license shooting gallery;
- (c) To firing squads for ceremonials; nor
- (d) To a legitimate gunsmith in pursuit of his or her trade.

It shall be a defense that the defendant was acting within the scope of K.S.A. 21-3211, K.S.A. 21-3212, K.S.A. 21-3213, K.S.A. 21-3215 or K.S.A. 21-3216.

SECTION 3: Any person convicted of violating this ordinance shall be fined in an amount not to exceed \$500.00.


