

ORDINANCE NO. 1938

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ADDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF CHAPTER XV, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BURLINGAME, KANSAS:

Article 1 General Provisions of Chapter XV Utilities of the Code of Burlingame, Kansas is hereby amended by adding a section which reads as follow::

15-114. Unpaid Utilities; Lien


In the event a utility customer shall move from one property served by the City utility services to another property leaving an unpaid utility bill at the first mentioned property then no City utility service shall be furnished to said customer at such property to which they move until said bill is paid in full.

In the event any person shall neglect, fail or refuse to pay within 10 days following the date notice of delinquency of payment of the utility bill was mailed or delivered to the customer or if a hearing has been requested pursuant to Section 15-104, and upon the conclusion of a hearing finding the utility bill to be due and unpaid, then such utility billing and charges shall constitute a lien upon the real property served by the utility service, and shall be certified by the City Clerk to the County Clerk of Osage County, Kansas, to be placed upon the tax roll for collection, subject to the same charges and penalties and collected in the same manner as other taxes are by law collectible.

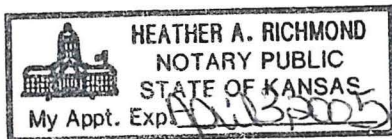
