E. Code Enforcement Updates – Police Chief Baker/Building Inspector Welch

 - Weatherproofing of building front and back
 - The building needs to be dried out to stop further water damage
 - If the above items are repaired in a timely manner, the building will be strong enough to wait on the grant money

She provided a list of nine Furbearers approved to trap and remove foxes in Osage County. Officer Baker will post this information on our Facebook. It will be up to the homeowner to contact the approved Furbearers and to pay their fee.
