He said in their review of the credit card payments, there were times when sales tax was paid in error. Need to be mindful of not paying the sales tax. The gas fund showed as being negative at the end of the year. This is a violation of K.S.A. 10-1113. City Superintendent Holman advised he has fixed the issue with the transportation costs in the gas fund and it will not be negative in the future and the lost revenue will be recovered.
