10. Staff Reports

- a. Building Inspector Welch
 - Reviewed the cost to demolish a trailer would be \$2000 per trailer plus dumping
 - Cost to demolish 108 East Lincoln will be \$10 to \$12,000. He will get bids to demo the property
 - Need to look at increasing the budget for 2024 to \$15,000 per property
 - Fees to demolish a residence can be charged to the property owner as a special on the taxes. If the property
 owner doesn't want the lot, it can be donated to the City's Land Bank
 - Need to review City of Osage tear down and rebuilt incentives
 - The current size for the smallest home allowed to be built is 600 square feet on a permanent foundation.
